

Our Mission

To provide tuition assistance to individuals active in a 12-step recovery program from alcohol or substance use disorder who demonstrate financial need and are pursuing an academic or vocational education.

Our Vision

We want to help all individuals in the St. Louis bi-state metropolitan area, who are in a 12-step recovery program and meet defined scholarship criteria, achieve all of their educational goals.

Our Values

We believe education is one of the best ways to rise above addiction.

We have respect for diversity: individuals of all backgrounds, ages, and educational interests are welcome to apply for a scholarship.

We want to help those who are already helping themselves.

About the Scholarship Program

- Since 2005, The Next Step has awarded 832 scholarships and over \$1.9 million in funding.
- Candidates must be active in a 12-step recovery program, have at least one year of recovery by the April 1st application deadline, show financial responsibility and need, be gainfully employed at least part-time, and live in the St. Louis bi-state metropolitan area.
- All qualified applicants have an interview with two board members.
- Scholarship recipients must maintain a 2.0 GPA, provide schedules and transcripts each semester, and complete service work for The Next Step.
- Scholarship funds are applied to tuition and books and are given directly to the educational institution.



Grace's path to recovery began with a frightening experience that ended in the emergency room. Her struggle with substance use had reached its most severe point, endangering her life on many occasions. She struggled to function on a personal and academic level. With the help of a strong support network of doctors, her therapist, partner, and sponsor, Grace has been sober since November 2019.

Like many others in the scholarship program, Grace started her college education, but her struggles with addiction prevented her from excelling. She was in and out of college for three years, facing many obstacles in her academic progress. The money her parents had set aside for her education was instead used for in-patient rehabilitation services. Grace was determined to finish her education but would need financial support to achieve her goals.

I am so grateful for the financial support I needed to achieve my goals.

"Receiving this scholarship made it possible for me to attend Maryville University as a full-time student," stated Grace. "I already work part-time but couldn't take on more hours without reducing my course load. Now, I'm going to be able to graduate on schedule in Spring 2024 from Maryville's Pre-Occupational Therapy Program with a Bachelor's degree in Psychology."

Additionally, Grace was a recipient this year of the Gina May Wiese Memorial Scholarship (pg 15), which provides additional funding to students who demonstrate classroom excellence and respect and caring for others.

"I am so grateful for both The Next Step and Gina May Wiese Memorial scholarships. I believe I was meant to be an occupational therapist and will provide exceptional care to all my patients. I could not have done it without your help."

THE APPLICATION PROCESS



Step 1 Confirm Eligibility

Candidates must be active in a 12-step recovery program, have a minimum of one year of recovery by the April 1st application deadline, show financial need, and be employed full or part-time. Applicants must live in the St. Louis bi-state metropolitan area, but can attend school anywhere.



Step 2 Apply by April 1, 2024

Scholarship applications are accepted until midnight on April 1, 2024. Candidates will answer questions regarding their recovery program, employment, educational goals and background, and financial history and need. Candidates must provide a sponsor letter of recommendation and proof of employment.



Step 3 Applicant Interviews

If qualified, applicants will be invited to have an interview with two board members, which will occur in mid-April. This interview helps further determine eligibility and financial need, and helps us get to know the candidate. Interviewers complete a point-based evaluation form to help determine scholarship awards.



Step 4 Scholarship Awards

After interviews, the scholarship committee determines awards for each candidate using the evaluation forms. The average award is \$3,200. Applicants are notified of their awards by the end of May. New recipients will meet in person in June to learn about the scholarship process and service work opportunities.





Ronald spent most of his adult life struggling with heroin addiction. At the age of 65, by the grace of his higher power, he became clean and sober.

Early in his recovery, Ronald committed to giving back what was freely given to him. He already had an Associate's degree in General Studies but learned that he could get a certificate in Addiction Counseling from St. Louis Community College. He didn't even have an email address when he first applied to school.



After receiving a scholarship from The Next Step, he dove into his studies. He navigated the college system after being out of school for so long, all the while volunteering tirelessly at his senior living community and maintaining his sobriety. Ronald says about the scholarship he received, "I wouldn't have been able to go back to school without the scholarship. I was on a fixed income, and the scholarship paid for my books and tuition. And thanks to the scholarship and not having to worry about funds, I was able to graduate with a GPA of 3.7."

Ronald received his certificate in Addiction Counseling in the Spring of 2019. He now works as a Peer Support Specialist at Adapt/Compass Health. His role includes sharing his lived recovery experiences with others, sharing and supporting recovery tools, and modeling successful recovery behaviors.

"My education gave me the opportunity to help provide the hope of recovery to other people," states Ronald. "I'm helping save lives, just like mine was once saved. It's a wonderful and fulfilling career!"

Tina was an alcoholic for most of her life and a drug addict for more than half. She found herself facing life in prison and chose to go to drug court. It took her a very long time to get it together, but today, her sobriety is at the forefront of everything in her life. She prays, mediates, talks to her sponsor daily, sponsors other women, and does service work. Tina is also in the process of getting approved to take meetings into the county jails.

Tina's educational goals are simple: to complete the certifications and licenses she needs to help others live their best lives. "My ultimate goal is to give back to others," said Tina. "I have something unique and special to share with the world, and I'm determined to do that."

Tina received her first scholarship this year and enrolled in classes at St. Louis Community College. She is working towards an Associate's degree in Human Services. "I will need a

degree and training to achieve my goals. This scholarship is giving me the financial support to do just that."

Tina's inspiration for returning to school came from her husband, Patrick, who is also one of our current scholarship recipients. Patrick is attending the University of Missouri - St. Louis to get a degree in Social Work, and works for Criminal Justice Ministries. Tina said, "I see the work that Patrick does, and it fulfills him in a way that neither of us saw coming. I am not dissatisfied with my life, I just want more of it. I want that type of fulfillment."


